The Village of Middleburgh has been quite busy the past few months but, all is well as we brush through the seasons and our ever-changing surroundings of nature.

Speaking of changes, 111 Railroad has been officially removed as of August 25th. In its place a public parking lot will be constructed by the DPW.

Along with the changes there's also been some much-needed updates. As of late the Village has been quite paving happy with the freshly paved roads for Straub Lane, Wells Avenue and newly poured sidewalks on Schribner Avenue and Railroad Avenue. With this, a drainage project has been completed on Danforth Avenue.

In September, the Village received a \$50,000 EFC Engineering Planning Grant to study the sewer line expansion for Grove Street and surrounding neighborhoods.

The Village has applied for a competitive grant to improve the community pool. While the pool's structure is sound, all auxiliary components, including the bathrooms, changing rooms, and pumphouse, require replacement. The Pool Revitalization Committee unanimously voted in favor of applying for the grant. The grant carries an 80/20 stipulation, meaning the Village would be responsible for 20% of the total costs.

2025 Time Capsule

In early October the time capsule was filled with local Village memorabilia such as restaurant menus, current newspapers, a MidTel "phonebook," Class of 2025 High School yearbook, a vintage parking meter mechanism, a thumb drive with pictures of the village and most importantly, a Peking fortune cookie. The Time Capsule is planned to be unearthed in 25 years. – *Village of Middleburgh Intern Antonio Remache*.
