# VILLAGE OF MIDDLEBURGH WINTER NEWSLETTER

*February 2026 Edition*

Every January, a group of lovely ladies who were part of the Century Club host a luncheon for Village and Town Employees as recognition for their public service. Now I wanted to take a few moments to thank Bonnie Jorgensen, Deb Roberts, Carrie Foland, Cathy Bezman, Stephanie Tinker, and Marie Whittaker for always remembering our hard-working staff here in Middleburgh with their thoughtful appreciation – *Village of Middleburgh Mayor Timothy Knight*.

### Village Updates:

- The Village Board adopted the 2026 Village Budget with a slight .89% property tax increase to provide additional funds for the Middleburgh Fire Department.
- The Village DPW Crew installed a “Dead End” sign at the corner of Union Street and MT Path upon resident request, improved the placement of the Elementary School Crossing Light, and installed a retaining wall and material at the 111 Railroad Avenue Parking Lot.
- Mayor Knight “Swore-In” Village Trustees Amanda Fernandez and Sheryl Adams, who were re-elected unopposed by Village residents in November 2025.
- The Village Board approved the creation of a Parks Improvement Fund to move forward with upgrading Badgley Park in the coming years.
- The Village Board appointed Angela Lawyer as the new President of the Middleburgh Area Business Association. She is a familiar face at Mrs. K’s Restaurant.
- The Village Board held a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for Windswept Farm & Apothecary who recently opened up their small business in our community. Additional ribbon cuttings are being scheduled for The Yellow Dog Tavern and The Country Café.
- The Village Board approved Delaware Engineering to conduct a study on extending municipal sewer lines on Grove Street and correcting existing Infiltration & Inflow issues. The Village received a \$50,000 Environmental Planning Grant for this project.
- The Village Board is eyeing a joint project with Schoharie County to make improvements on Clauverwie Road, including sidewalks, streets, and water lines.
- The Village Board voted to decrease sewer debt redemption rates by \$3.50 per quarter and to increase water debt redemption rates by \$3.20 per quarter.
- The Village Board declared January 7, 2026, as “Pasta & Grill Day” to recognize that restaurant’s twentieth anniversary in Middleburgh.
- The Village DPW Crew installed a new radar sign on a portable trailer upon resident request. The sign will be deployed to Clauverwie Road, River Street, and other high-speed areas around the community.
- The Village Board mourns the passing of Steve LaMont, our longtime Historian, former President of the Middleburgh Library Association, and Past Chief of the Huntersland Fire Department.
- The Village DPW Crew has been busy managing the snowy weather this winter. Just a reminder: businesses and homeowners are responsible for clearing your own sidewalks and fire hydrants. Additionally, please avoid parking on local streets during snow removal.
