

A Special Meeting of the Village Board was held on June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2026 at Village Hall

Present: Mayor Timothy Knight; Trustees: Sheryl Adams, Amanda Fernandez, Kevin Young, Robert Tinker, Clerk Rebecca Kelley & Fire Chief Jerry Waman.

Mayor Knight called meeting to order at 7:00 PM with Pledge of Allegiance.

Trustee Young made a motion seconded by Trustee Tinker, to approve Resolution 10-2026: Yellow Dog Tavern Liquor License Waiver. Upon roll call vote, this motion was unanimously carried 5-0.

Trustee Tinker made a motion, seconded by Trustee Adams to accept Middleburgh Telephone Co. donation of \$4,000 towards fireworks purchase for 250th Community Celebration on July 3, 2026. Upon roll call vote, this motion was unanimously carried 5-0.

Trustee Young made a motion, seconded by Trustee Fernandez to amend Budget and Increase A6410.4 Publicity Contractual by \$4,000. Upon roll call vote, this motion was unanimously carried 5-0.

Trustee Adams made a motion, seconded by Trustee Tinker to authorize DPW Superintendent to purchase up to \$4,000 in fireworks. Upon roll call vote, this motion was unanimously carried 5-0.

The Board discussed the 315 Main Street Mural project. After talking with the muralist, she would like to pause for the time being due to negative community feedback online, but she is open to another mural project in the future. The Board understands her decision, and they hope in the future that doesn't happen again.

The Board discussed the location of new Main Street pedestrian crossing lights. After meeting with DPW Superintendent Keyser to talk over the first location, 309 Main St. -- 310 Main St. crosswalk, Mayor Knight agreed that there's already multiple obstructions near that crosswalk; trees, non-lit crosswalk sign, hanging baskets, hometown hero banners, flags, other signage, and telephone poles on both sides. Even though school is almost over, Mayor Knight suggested the lights be installed at the High School Crosswalk, 291 Main St. – 294 Main St. There's plenty of activities going on at the school throughout the summer with Arts & Crafts, Open Gym, Tennis lessons, and the pool opening, so the crosswalk will still be used regularly. After discussion it was Consensus of the Board to approve the Main Street pedestrian crossing lights be placed at 291 Main St. -- 294 Main St. upon approval by NYSDOT.

Trustee Tinker made a motion, seconded by Trustee Adams to accept, with appreciation for more than twenty years of service, Deputy Code Enforcement Officer Lloyd Stannard's Resignation, Effective June 11, 2026. Upon roll call vote, this motion was unanimously carried 5-0.

Mayor Knight proposed Code Enforcement Officer Frederick "Rick" Fink be given \$1.00 raise for remainder of year which budget wise would not change anything. The Board agreed. Trustee Young abstained from voting on this motion due to personal relationship with Code Officer Fink.

Trustee Tinker made a motion, seconded by Trustee Adams to increase Code Enforcement Officer Fink's hourly wage by \$1.00 per hour. Upon roll call vote, this motion was unanimously carried 4-0.

Mayor Knight reached out to the JRC to see if any lifeguards would be interested in picking up extra hours by helping with parking enforcement in the Village during the busy summer months: issuing warnings and writing tickets. Lifeguards Gabrielle Armlin and Troy Cammer are fourth year returning employees and would like to take on additional duties. After discussing the duties, Trustee Young made a motion, seconded by Trustee Tinker to approve parking enforcement role for Gabrielle Armlin and Troy Cammer. Upon roll call vote, this motion was unanimously carried 5-0.

Trustee Tinker made a motion, seconded by Trustee Young to adjourn at 7:35PM. Upon roll call vote, this motion was unanimously carried 5-0.
